JUDGES PROFILES

Brian Miller - National Holstein Judge

Brian farms 450 acres in Somerset and has a dairy herd comprising of 230 Holstein and 10 Brown Swiss cattle. After completing an Agricultural Economics degree at the University of Reading Brian decided to join the family business with his father and grandmother. Their herd has been a finalist six times in the Holstein UK herd competition and the family regularly show at regional and national level.



Recent herd highlights include Moorshard Lennon Rosa 93 winning Dairy Show Championship, becoming reserve All Britain 2nd Calver in 2013 and, most recently, seeing Richard Thomas' family winning The Dairy Show and Welsh Dairy Shows with Moorshard Dude Parade, which he purchased at the Genetic Elite sale in 2014.

Brian has been involved in many prestigious Holstein competitions and his judging repertoire spans county, regional and international shows. Brian has judged at the National Dairy Event and in 2016 was Holstein judge at the All Breed All Britain Calf Show.

James Waring – Jersey Judge



Previous judging highlights for James include judging the jerseys at the Royal Welsh (2013), Balmoral (2013), Livestock Event (2014) and All Britain Calf Show (2010). He farms in partnership with his parents in East Yorkshire, where they keep the Winton herd of Holsteins and Cherryview herd of Jerseys. The farm is 200 acres with a further 100 acres rented.

Edmund Els – National Ayrshire Judge



Edmund Els from South Africa is a world renowned and respected Ayrshire breeder, and we look forward to welcoming him to the UK to officiate The National Ayrshire Show. Edmund is from the Western Cape of South Africa and is the owner of The Ridge Ayrshire herd of 200 pedigree Ayrshires. He is a passionate breeder who has bred and owned several champions through the years, and most recently at the National Show in Bredasdorp he received awards for the National Senior and Reserve Senior Cow, Reserve Junior Animal, Champion Heifer and Reserve National Grand Champion.

Edmund was breed director for the South African Ayrshire Society from 2005 – 2012 and has also served on the Ayrshire board for many years. He is also one of the South African representatives at the World Ayrshire Federation and was part of the committee for hosting the South Africa Ayrshire World Conference in 2012.

Ian Collins – Shorthorn Judge



Ian Collins runs The Churchroyd herd of 130 milking animals, including Dairy Shorthorn and Holsteins cows, in Dewsbury, Yorkshire. Churchroyd's showing highlights in 2016 were winning Supreme Champion at both Cheshire Show and The Great Yorkshire Show.

He has previously judged many shows in the UK, as well as Balmoral Show, Northern Ireland, and The Royal Show in South Africa. In his younger days, he won the National Young Farmers Stock Judging.

Glyn Lucas - Brown Swiss Judge



Since 2004 Glyn Lucas has been managing the dairy sales at Harrison & Hetherington Ltd. and is now the Senior Pedigree Auctioneer. Glyn was raised at Lukevale Holsteins, a registered Holstein farm in Co Antrim, Northern Ireland. He was a self-employed, professional dairy cattle fitter for eight years before joining the livestock sales industry.

This work took him across North America and to many foreign countries where he prepared, showed and owned numerous All-Canadians, All-Americans and Grand Champions. Glyn's judging career has included assignments to numerous shows in the UK, Ireland and Belgium. He has been on the UK National Judging Panel for the past seven years and was a attendee of the Canadian National Judging Conference in 2008.

David Mann - Guernsey Judge



Cornish farmer, David Mann, has lived on the family farm his whole life and now manages the business in partnership with his parents. The family farm consists of a coastal plateau of land, rising from 100ft to 730ft above sea level. This includes rough moorland and grazing fields for the 170 pedigree Guernsey cows plus 130 followers. The herd are in the

fields for most of the year due to the milder climate, grazing grass during the summer and kale through the winter, and are cubicle housed for only 3-4 months of the year. The herd average is 6,300 litres at 4.98% butterfat and 3.6% protein, and in the herd there are currently 38 EX and 56 VG.

UK DAIRY DAY INFORMATION & REGULATIONS

Please observe the following rules for your safety, the smooth running of the show and the enjoyment of all who visit in any capacity.

Show Opening Times

Wednesday 13th September 2017- 8.00am to 5.30pm

1. Arrival & Departure

Dairy cattle may be admitted on to site from 3pm on Sunday 10th September until 8pm on Tuesday 12th September. Cattle may leave after the end of the show on Wednesday 13th September and, in all instances, must be removed from site by 10am on Thursday 14th September.

2. Entry Fees

There will be no cost for occupied stalls at this year's UK Dairy Day thanks to the sponsorship kindly provided by Anglia Farmers Limited. However, each individual stall that is booked but remains unoccupied for cattle will incur a charge of £50.00/stall (inclusive of VAT).

All charges for extra stalls will be deducted from prize money before the payment will be made.

3. Stall Reservations, Catalogue Entries & Fees

An exhibitor/team may reserve, at the fee stated above, any number of stalls they require.

4. Substitutes

Substitute entries will be accepted; please ensure you notify the cattle office immediately.

5. Prize Money

Prize money will be distributed as follows in each class:

Rosettes and prize cards are to be awarded down to 10th place, plus tail ribbons for Best Udder, Exhibitor Bred & Highest Production in each class. Championship Sashes will be awarded to each Senior Breed Champion.

Prize money will be paid by BACS direct to the bank account details provided on the stall booking form or, alternatively, you can have it credited to your Holstein UK/CIS account. All charges for extra stalls will be deducted from the prize money before payment will be made.

6. Exhibitor Wristbands

All livestock exhibitors will be required to wear identification wristbands at all times whilst on site; wristbands will allow 24 hour access to the livestock hall, as well as entry to the trade show and 15%

discount at the canteen located upstairs in the Ironbridge Suite.
Wristband allocation is unlimited.

7. Accommodation

All teams exhibiting will be required to book their own accommodation;

Unfortunately, we are unable to offer any camping and caravanning facilities on site.

8. Stockman's Catering

The stockman's canteen will be located in the Ironbridge Suite at the top of the stairs from the foyer. UK Dairy Day has secured a 15% discount on all food from the canteen for stockmen with a stockman's wristband. Complimentary breakfast roll vouchers and tea & coffee will also be provided.

9. Dress

Leaders must wear society uniform when in the ring.

10. Bedding

Straw will be provided on arrival and will be available for exhibitors throughout the event. Sawdust, fodder and haylage will NOT be provided and will NOT be available to buy at on site.

Please note - deliveries of the above must be organised with the UK Dairy Day team prior to its arrival.

11. Ventilation

Two Altra Air fans will be installed in the cattle hall, kindly sponsored by Wilson Agri. These fans have the capacity to move up to 395,000 cfm over a 60 to 70ft area. Exhibitors will not be permitted to erect their own fan.

12. Acceptance of Entries

The show reserves the right to refuse any entry without providing reasons. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors/teams to ensure stall bookings are posted well in advance of the closing date. Closing dates are final and will be strictly enforced, entries received after the closing date cannot be guaranteed.

13. Cancellation or Combining of Classes

The show reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes if it is decided that there are insufficient entries or exhibitors. If a breed is unable to attract 15 or more stall bookings, classes will be cancelled, all entry fees will be refunded in these circumstances.

14. Checking of Entry Details

Exhibitors/teams are entirely responsible for the eligibility of their animals for the classes entered and should check that all details are complete and accurate before submission.

15. Competitor/Exhibitor Declaration

By completing the entry form (in any section), you agree to abide by the regulations of the UK Dairy Day. Any exhibitors/team that break any of the show rules or uses unfair means to win a prize will forfeit all prizes and prize money and may be barred from attending future shows.

16. Passports

All animals must be accompanied by their BCMS passports and double tagged with official UK Ear Tags.

17. Claims

Holstein UK, its officers or agents (whether negligent or not) shall not be liable for any claims of losses or damages by an exhibitor/team in relation to the show.

18. Rules

The ruling of the show management in relation to any matters concerning the event shall be final and binding to all concerned. At any one time they have the powers to reject any unsuitable animal.

19. Veterinary Inspection

All cattle will be subject to veterinary inspection at the discretion of the show management and show veterinary officer. Any treatment by the vet will be recharged to the exhibitor.

20. Ringworm

All cattle showing signs of ringworm must have a veterinary certificate showing that they have been treated for at least two weeks prior to the show, and the lesions must be inactive and have hair growing on them. Any animal not adhering to this rule with ringworm lesions will not be allowed into the show.

21. Udder Scanning

Udder scanning will be carried out at the show at the discretion of the organisers.

22. Bovine Tuberculosis Regulations

The show organiser requires that ALL cattle attending the event are pre-movement tested despite the location of their holding of origin. The pre-movement test is valid for 60 days from the date of injection NOT the date of reading. Please be aware of this before attending any shows and book your test(s) in plenty of time. When attending UK Dairy Day 2017 you will need to TB test on the 17th July (at the earliest) to ensure you are within the 60-day period when departing the showground on Thursday 14th September.

All exhibitors are required to supply a copy of their TB certificate to the Show Office PRIOR to arrival at the venue. Copies accepted by post, fax or email to cattleoffice@ukdairyday.co.uk
